Staff Updates by Department

Public Services Administration & Engineering

- •Curb realignment and paving work for the Turner Street Broad Street intersection improvements is complete. Pavement markings are expected to be placed soon.
- •Engineering staff continued their efforts to obtain all of the property owner easements needed to be able to construct a sidewalk along Live Oak Street from Mulberry Street to Campen Road.

Public Utilities

- Public Utilities staff installed several wastewater air valve pit systems at new residential construction sites within the Beaufort Club subdivision.
- •Reinstalled a rebuilt version of a pump at sewer lift station No. 9 due to its failure.
- Completed startup inspection of a residential-type sewer pumping system for a new residential unit in the Gallant's Point subdivision.
